PreK Sessions

Module 1 - **The Key Components of Communication in Young Children** – This session will focus on the nuts and bolts of oral language. Parents will learn when and how language is learned. Parents will also learn tips and techniques to nurture language development. Each participant will be given activities that can be used at home to create a literacy-rich environment.

Module 2 - **How to Foster Early Reading Skills** – In this session parents will learn about what tips and techniques they should use to help their child develop the skills to become successful readers. Parents will learn how to help their children with letter and sound recognition. Parents will also learn about print awareness and book handling. Families will be exposed to popular children's literature and learn how to select developmentally and culturally appropriate books.

Module 3 - **Early Writing Skills** – In this session, parents will learn how to encourage writing in the home. Children will often scribble and write before they read. Parents will be given easy-to-use tips that will help their child love writing and develop fine motor skills.
